

## HEAR FROM THE WORLD'S LEADING CURATORS AT FUTURE NOW

Future Now welcomes curators, gallerists and directors from MoMA, MASS MoCA, The Armory Show and Gagosian to discuss the future of the art landscape.

The idea of the gallery closing down for months on end is not something we could fathom before 2020. The pandemic has prompted us to ask questions about the future of the arts landscape: how do you curate exhibitions when society has been redefining every facet of existence for the past 18 months? Are the exhibition themes pre-pandemic still relevant, and how are curators ensuring that exhibitions have widespread public engagement? Do hybrid shows translate well? What is the future of the gallery and how is programming evolving?

At Future Now 2021, seminal panel discussions bring together some of the world's leading institutions as we start to unravel what it means to be a curator today. Key speakers include David Campany, International Center of Photography; Rand Suffolk, High Museum; Sarah Meister, MoMA; Antwaun Sargent, Gagosian; and Kyung An Hui, Guggenheim Museum; Margot Norton, New Museum New York, Denise Markonish, Mass MoCA, Chiara Costa, Fondazione Prada, Eva Respini, ICA Boston, Devika Singh, Tate and Zoe Whitley, Chisenhale. Beyond curation, the landscape of commercial galleries and fairs has also changed rapidly over the last 12 months. How has the virtual model worked? Are collectors still investing in artists? Moreover, have the criteria for representation changed? Are gallerists taking more risks? On Friday 30 April, Future Now welcomes a panel of esteemed experts from a range of disciplines and backgrounds. Eliza Osborne, Armory Show; Mary-Alice Stack, Creative United; Touria El-Glaoui, 1-54 Contemporary African Art Fair and Eva Langret, Frieze, explore the art market in 2021 and beyond.



The Future Now Symposium runs live 28 April-1 May. All sessions are available On Demand until 31 May. Tickets are priced between £20 and £50, from a 24-hour festival login to a month of content, with access to 100 films, 1:1 portfolio reviews with industry experts and advice sessions with Arts Council England.
